INFORMATION REGARDING DILATING EYE DROPS

Dilating drops are used to dilate or enlarge the pupil of the eye to allow the optometrist to get a better view of the inside of your eye.

Dilating drops frequently blur vision for a length of time which varies from person to person and may make bright lights bothersome. It is not possible for your optometrist to predict how much your vision will be affected. Because of this, driving and getting around immediately after an examination may be difficult (such as falls, etc) and one should make arrangements to not drive and to have someone assist in getting around.

Adverse reaction, such as acute angle-closure glaucoma, may be triggered from the dilating drops. This is extremely rare and treatable with immediate medical attention.

I hereby authorize my optometrist and/or such assistants as may be designated by him/her to administer dilating eye drops. The eye drops are necessary to diagnose my condition. I understand the risks and wish to proceed with dilation of the eyes.
